

Ensuite, votre enfant peut repasser sur les lettres avec son doigt puis un crayon... Toujours en respectant le sens des lettres.


Si vous avez l'occasion de plastifier le prénom, vous pourrez l'utiliser à l'infini avec un simple marqueur à l'eau.

Bon travail et amusez-vous !







